Stage Director Robert Herriot's unique staging for this opera will be set in a Livermore vineyard, a first for an LVO opera.

## About The Elixir of Love (L'elisir d'amore)

But when it comes to love, the couple learns that the real thing – love that is – beats any elixir the doctor can concoct. Donizetti's beloved comic opera will charm audiences with laughs and memorable music.

Stage director Robert Herriot returns to LVO to direct a stellar cast including tenor **Christopher Bozeka**, soprano **Elena Galván** and bass-baritone **Samuel Weiser**. The performances will be expertly accompanied by orchestra, conducted by LVO's maestro, Alex Katsman. Sung in Italian with English supertitles.

"Elixir is a charming story with wonderful music featuring one of the greatest tenor arias in the repertoire, *Una furtiva lagrima*," says Erie Mills, LVO Artistic Director. "It's the perfect opera for first-time opera-goers or aficionados."
