Livermore Valley Opera Presents a 2023-24 Season of Contrasts From Stark Reality to Flights of Fancy

LIVERMORE, CALIF. – The Tri-Valley's own professional opera company, the Livermore Valley Opera (LVO), announces its 32nd season featuring two fully-staged operas. In October, 2023, LVO opens the season with Carlisle Floyd's compelling adaptation of John Steinbeck's novella *Of Mice and Men,* a tragic American story of shattered dreams, and then in March, 2024, LVO presents Mozart's *The Magic Flute,* a fairy tale for all ages and one of the greatest operas ever written. In a recent TV30 interview segment of "Conversations with Mel McKay," LVO Board President Keith Sawyer expressed his tremendous pride in being part of "this hidden gem of arts that we have in our community," a world-class opera company that attracts "phenomenal talent." Tickets are on sale now at the Bankhead Theater in downtown Livermore, and ticket buyers who purchase both operas together will receive the best seats at a 10% discount. Both operas will be sung in English and expertly accompanied by the LVO orchestra, conducted by maestro Alexander Katsman.

About Of Mice and Men

Stage Director Marc Jacobs will bring the forceful tale of two depression-era farm workers whose dream of owning their own land one day ends in tragedy. Carlisle Floyd, arguably the greatest of America's 20th Century opera composers, adapts to the operatic stage a vivid representation of John Steinbeck's story that will grip audiences with its powerful music and timeless themes. In the opinion of the late composer himself, this is his greatest operatic achievement.
